YCMBT - Dedicated to Marine Conservation for 25 Years!

Capt. Harry Vernon, Jr. Scholarship Fund \$5,000

This scholarship fund has been created as a dedication for the late Capt. Harry D. Vernon, Jr. This year, the scholarship is awarded to five worthy students studying billfish conservation research at the University of Miami's Rosenstiel School. (305-361-9258)

Circle of Friends Memorial Scholarship \$7,000

This scholarship fund has been created in memory of Jim Hardie. The scholarship helps fund students at the University of Miami's Rosenstiel School who are studying fisheries science and management. This year, the scholarship is awarded to seven students.

University of Miami Experimental Hatchery \$4,200

Funds will be used to expand research into forensic technologies to identify pelagic fish body parts in trade.
