## **Capt. Harry Vernon, Jr. Scholarship Fund \$1,000**

This scholarship fund has been created as a dedication for the late Capt. Harry D. Vernon, Jr. This year, the scholarship is awarded to five worthy students studying billfish conservation research at the University of Miami's Rosenstiel School.

## **University of Miami Experimental Hatchery \$1,000**

We are honored to continue our support of the University's study of billfish, which presently is focussing on the enhancement of life larval billfish collection. These funds will help with the purchase of collection nets and related equipment.

## **Florida Keys Marine Laboratory \$1,000**

Located in Layton, the Keys Marine Lab facility hosts 100 marine research and education projects yearly. The facility offers dorm style housing, boats with operators, experiment holding facilities, wet & dry labs and collecting assistance to off-site researchers.
